HISTORY

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Two California Senate bills -- SB 866, authored by Senators Richard Pan and Scott Wiener; and SB 871, authored by Senator Richard Pan – are being considered by the Legislature. These bills have implications for California schools and school-age children.

CURRENT CONSIDERATIONS

It is the desire of the board to reaffirm the message of Resolution No. 2122-43, which addresses the impact that will be felt by SB 871; to empower representatives to speak on our behalf regarding SB 871; and to provide District parents with impartial information about SB 871 and SB 866.

RESOLUTION NO. 2122-43, REAFFIRMATION OF CUSD RESOLUTION NO. 2122-20 AND REQUEST FOR CUSD FAMILIES TO RECEIVE INFORMATIONAL MESSAGES ABOUT CALIFORNIA SENATE BILLS 871 AND 866

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2021, the Board of Trustees of the Capistrano Unified School District passed and approved Resolution Number 2122-20, "Urgent Request to Governor Gavin Newsom to Reconsider or Rescind the COVID-19 Vaccine Mandate for Public and Private K-12 Students as a Requirement for In-Person Instruction;" and

WHEREAS, we are seriously concerned that the passage and adoption of California Senate Bill 871 (Pan) will result in substantial numbers of California families choosing to leave traditional in-person K-12 schools, thereby crippling California's existing public and private school systems and resulting in the loss of many school staff jobs; and,

WHEREAS, it is within the purview of a public school district to provide timely information to parents about potential legislation affecting school-aged children, such as California Senate bills SB 871 and SB 866; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Superintendent is directed to send letters communicating the opposition of the Board of Trustees to SB 871 to the Governor, Speaker of the Assembly, President Pro-Tem of the Senate, and members of the Legislature of the State of California; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes the President of the Board and the Superintendent, or their designees, to speak on our behalf regarding our opposition to SB 871; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Superindent of the Capistrano Unified School District is directed to provide impartial, informational email or text messages to District parents about SB 871 and SB 866 in both English and Spanish, directing their attention to a district web page about the bills, along with contact information for legislators and relevant Senate and Assembly committee members.
