## CEREMONIES AND OBSERVANCES

## Patriotic Exercises

Principals and teachers shall teach students to honor and care for the American flag to the end that it may be treated with respect and handled with reverence at all times. The American flag will be displayed in classrooms and meeting rooms in accordance with the Federal Flag Code.

Every elementary and secondary school shall conduct appropriate patriotic exercises each day during the school year at the beginning of the first regularly scheduled class, or activity period at which the majority of the students of the school begin the day, conduct appropriate patriotic exercises. These exercises shall include, at the least, a recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. Other patriotic observances such as songs, quotations, and raising of the flag are encouraged but will be carried out at the discretion of school personnel.

The District respects the legal right of individuals not to participate in the salute to the flag for personal reasons.

## Holidays

District schools shall be closed in observance of the following holidays:

| Thanksgiving Day | That Thursday in November designated by the President |
| Christmas Day | December 25 |

Holidays which fall on a Sunday shall be observed the following Monday. Holidays which fall on a Saturday shall be observed the preceding Friday. If any of the above holidays occurs under federal law on a date different from that indicated above, the Board may close the schools on the date recognized by federal law instead of on the date above.
